WEEK 3: PROJECT

THIS PROJECT IS GREAT FOR ALL AGES!

“People that have respect appreciate others.
Today we are going to write thank you cards to someone that we appreciate.”

Steps:

1. Purchase some standard thank you cards and crayons or markers. Make sure you have enough for all of your students.
2. Give each student a crayon (or marker) and thank you card.
3. Follow these instructions:
4. 3-5 year olds will draw a picture inside the thank you card for someone special in their family. You will need volunteers to help each child write their name and who the card is for.
5. 6-7 year olds will write a thank you note to a special family member for something nice they've done recently. You will need volunteers to help each child with spelling.
6. 8 and up will write a thank you note with at least three sentences to someone special for something nice they've done recently.

This project is meant to teach your students about showing appreciation for others, which is an important way to have and demonstrate respect. When you take the time to thank others it feels really good. Remind your students about the golden rule: treat others the way you want to be treated. If your students can master the golden rule, then they will have more success in life.

If you are using a patch or stripe system for your monthly character lessons, then reward each student with their patch or stripe.
