## WEEK 3: CHARACTER PROJECT

### THIS PROJECT IS GREAT FOR ALL AGES!

#### Steps:

1. You will need markers or crayons and a large poster board for this drill.
2. Divide your class into groups of 3 to 6.
3. Give each member of the group a different colored marker or crayon. This will be the only color they can use for this project. For smaller groups, you can give each person 2 or 3 colors.
4. The group must now create a picture, using all the colors. Each person may only use his/her color (no trading or sharing allowed.)

☆ **For 3 to 6-year olds:**

It's a good idea to have some parent volunteers help draw the outline of a picture, such as a tree with birds and flowers, and then the students can take turns coloring the picture in.

☆ **For 7 and up:**

Have them work together to decide what picture they will draw and what colors will be used for each item in the picture. For example, if the group decides to draw a tree, then the person with the brown will draw the trunk and color it in, and the person with the green will draw the leaves and color it in.

When they turn in their poster, give them a special character award.

For example:

- Special character stripe that they must earn in to test.
- Special prize from your prize chest.
- Special character patch, such as a gold star, for their uniform.

This is a great drill to teach the students about teamwork, because they will create a work of art together which will reveal several artistic expressions.
